The NSSRV is servicing farmers with secure access to good seed of improved varieties because all elements of the national seed system are working well together:

1. Variety Identification & Development

MAF researchers identify, select and develop the most productive varieties for official release and produce breeder and then foundation seed under highly controlled conditions on research stations.

2. Source Seed & Quality Control

Contract growers multiply foundation seed of officially released varieties under close supervision by MAF Seed Department, which then produces high quality certified seed.

3. Commercial Seed Producers (CSP)

Registered CSP must use certified seed and follow NSSRV quality assurance Guidelines to produce large quantities of commercial seed that the Ministry, agricultural supply shops, NGOs, farmers and others can purchase with confidence in the quality assurance of Fini ba Moris brand name, now the brand of NSSRV.

4. Community Seed Production Groups

CSPG are farmer groups which use certified or commercial seed to locally produce and properly store community seed for their members and other families in the community to use next season.

Farmers can increase their production of food crops through cuttings of improved varieties

Maize: Sele, Noi Mutin, Nai Rice: Nakroma Peanut: Utamua Sweet Potato: Hohrae 1, 2 and 3 Cassava: Ailuka 1, 2 and 4

MAF will soon release additional improved varieties of beans, rice and sweet potato.
